**Elk Foundation thins national forest land**

The Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation (RMEF) has a long-term stewardship agreement with the Forest Service, allowing the nonprofit conservation group to bid on, and support, projects that might enhance habitat for elk and other wildlife. RMEF was the successful bidder on several activities in the Meadow



-Smith Project, east of Highway 83.

RMEF contracted with Condon's Kvande Anderson (pictured) to thin a 45-year-old ponderosa pine plantation

originally planted in 1965 by his grandfather Tuffy Anderson. The thinning will allow the remaining trees to "release" and grow into a mature stand.

The Forest Service-RMEF agreement allows the nonprofit to contribute private funds to ensure completion of projects on national forest land

that might otherwise be too costly in today's markets.

RMEF contracted with SEC as the onsite contract administrator.

**Update: Montana Legacy Project**

The Swan Lake Ranger District, Flathead National Forest grew in mid-March by about 44,500 acres. The land held temporarily by The Nature Conservancy and The Trust for Public Land transferred ownership as part of Phase II of the Montana Legacy Project.

About 20,000 acres intermixed with the Swan River State Forest remain to transfer in December 2010 from Plum Creek Timber Company to the two national land trust organizations. These "Phase III" lands are destined for State ownership in 2011 or later.

**Backcountry rangers hired on 5-year contracts**

Swan Ecosystem Center has a formal "Cost/Share" agreement with the Flathead National Forest that allows SEC, a private non-profit organization, to help the Forest Service achieve some of its management goals.

Employing backcountry rangers to maintain trails and campsites and provide visitor information in the Mission Mountains Wilderness and on the Swan Range is one way the agreement is used. SEC has been employing backcountry rangers since 1997, in recent years on two separate five-year contracts, which are renewable each year, dependent on funding.

**Landowner assistance programs underway**

Most of Swan Ecosystem Center's cost-share funds for assisting landowners with forest health and fuels reduction are committed until new funding is secure.

SEC's Forest Stewards Mike Palladini and Roger Marshall are helping over 70 landowners complete forest management and conservation plans. This work has employed many local contractors.

SEC has a waiting list for forest stewardship cost-share assistance. Funding is available, however, for approved wetland restoration projects.

## Rangers continued

This winter SEC solicited bids for the 2010-14 contracts. Five bids for each of the Mission Mountains Wilderness and Swan Range contracts were received. The successful bidders will be awarded contracts by May 1.

Although SEC employs the backcountry rangers to conduct the Forest Service program of work, the Flathead National Forest determines which trails are to be open and maintained. SEC raises more than half the funds needed for these contracts. Sources include the Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks Recreation Trails Program, the National Forest Foundation and private donations.

### Raffle

The funds will be used to maintain 98 miles of wilderness and backcountry trails and provide visitor information to protect fragile alpine resources, people and wildlife.

## Half-marathon foot race to support backcountry trails

The Celebrate the Swan Race on Saturday, June 26 will support SEC's trail and campsite programs in the Mission Mountains Wilderness and the Swan Range.

Events will include a half-marathon, 10K and 5K races, and a 5K and 1 mile fun walk/run. The races will be held on forest roads in the Falls Creek area, east of the U.S. Forest Service Condon Work Center and airstrip.

The half-marathon will start at 9 a.m.; the other races will start at 10 a.m. Kids games will begin around 10:30 a.m. Entry forms and a race map are available on the SEC Web site: SwanEcosystemCenter.org.

## Southwestern Crown Collaborative

### Groups join forces, apply for grant to support three Forests

Swan Ecosystem Center, Northwest Connections, Clearwater Resources Council, and Blackfoot Challenge are working with their three national forest districts, and other partners, on a proposal that would fund fuels reduction and forest restoration in the three watersheds.

Congress allocated the competitive grant funding in early 2010. If successful, the grant could provide the districts with up to \$40 million over a 10-year period.

The Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Program proposal would support projects identified by the Swan Lake Ranger District, Seeley Lake Ranger District, and the Lincoln District. All are located within the Southwestern Crown—a 1.5 million acre portion of the greater Crown of the Continent Ecosystem, which includes the Bob Marshall Wilderness Complex, Waterton-Glacier International Peace Park, and surrounding lands and communities.

In addition to forest thinning to reduce fuels near homes, the proposal would provide funding to enhance forest resiliency, retain large trees, reduce sedimentation to lakes and streams, replace culverts, and other projects.

Other cooperators include The Wilderness Society, University of Montana, Montana DNRC, Montana Economic Development Group, Montana Forest Restoration Committee, and several others. Visit the Web site: [SWCrown.com](http://SWCrown.com).

### Summit to explore biomass use, inspire local entrepreneurship

A one-day seminar on Friday, May 7 at Double Arrow Lodge in Seeley Lake will explore the potential for local utilization of the woody material accumulating in our forests—not destined to become boards at a typical sawmill.

The purpose of the summit, “Emerging Markets for Woody Biomass,” is to learn about business opportunities relevant to our region, ranging from biochar to alternative energy to nontraditional wood products.

Loren Rose, Pyramid Mountain Lumber; Rosalie Cates, Montana Economic Development Group; and other speakers will lay the groundwork for discussion. Nils Christoffer-son, Wallowa Resources, Enterprise, Oregon; Joyce Dear- styne, Framing Our Community, Elk City, Idaho; and Bill Wall, Seeley Lake will bring examples of projects from around the region to inform and inspire development here.

The gathering is being hosted by four nonprofit groups in the Southwestern Crown—Blackfoot Challenge, Clearwater Resources Council, Northwest Connections and Swan Ecosystem Center. The University of Montana and the National Forest Foundation are providing support.

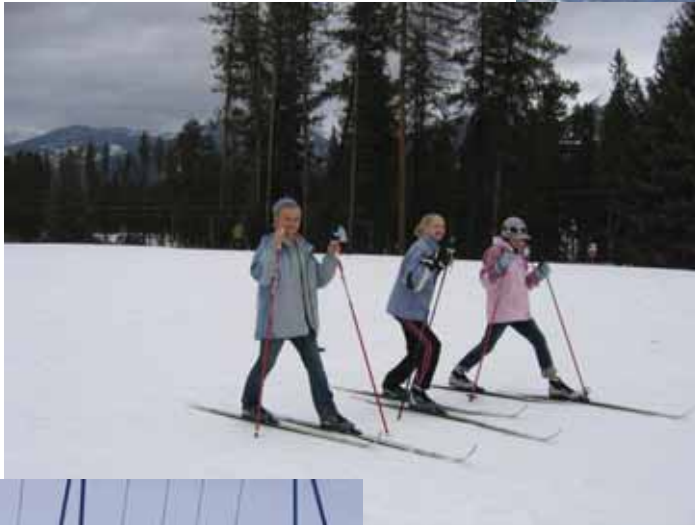
# Swan Valley School students enjoy skiing and snowshoeing

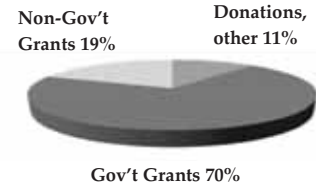
